



PATIENT DISASTER "TO DO" LIST

- ❑ Learn which evacuation zone your home is in and create a personal plan
- ❑ Learn your dialysis facility's emergency policies (scheduling / change of location pre and post event)
- ❑ Update your emergency contact information at the facility (local and out-of-state)
- ❑ Gather emergency supplies, medicines & personal papers and place in a secure container (plan for two weeks)
- ❑ Get a copy of the emergency diet for dialysis patients
- ❑ Plan for back-up transportation to dialysis
- ❑ Get a list of dialysis facilities and hospitals in the area
- ❑ Ask your social worker about "special shelters"
- ❑ Write down toll-free numbers to call for dialysis after the event (if your facility is closed)
- ❑ Listen to local TV and radio for "dialysis updates"
- ❑ PD patients should have enough supplies for 5 - 7 days
- ❑ Transplant patients should have enough medicine for two weeks
